JERRY LITTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The previous winner is Joe Eddy.


CHILLICOTHE LIVESTOCK MARKET AWARD

SHEEP ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

This award will be presented annually to a Senior FFA member who exhibited sheep as part of their SAE project. It is intended to recognize a student who has successfully completed their sheep projects, but has received no formal prizes or awards. The criteria for selection include care of animals, work ethic, pride in ownership and sportsmanship. The award consists of a \$50 savings bond and a trophy and is sponsored by Larry and Ida Brotherton.



Litton Center Opens

"Happy are those who dream dreams and are ready to pay the price to make them come true." That was the philosophy of Jerry Litton.

The Litton Agri-Science center was dedicated to the late Jerry Litton on June 12th of 1994. National FFA Secretary Andrew McCrea and John Saunders, who is Director of Agriculture for Missouri, spoke at the dedication ceremony at which 4-H and FFA members, and approximately 300 guests attended. The Center is located north of Chillicothe on a twenty-acre plot. The Center consists of a classroom, livestock facilities, a two-acre lake and an outdoor classroom.

The Litton Center has facilities for pigs, sheep and cattle. FFA and 4-H students are obligated to buy their own feed an do their chores.

Last year twenty-four students kept animals at the Litton Center. There were fourteen lambs, five steers and twenty hogs. The students all showed their livestock at the local fairs.

Students from the area Vo-Tech did a hands-on test for hog research. The project began with the purchase of twenty hogs from Reid Stephens. The hogs weighed ninety pounds when bought, and the students kept track of the pigs' growth rate at different stages of their lives. Percentages of fat were figured with types of feed used.
