This year the Chillicothe FFA Chapter qualified six teams and two speakers to compete at the State FFA Contest on April 20 and 21.

Our two speakers that qualified were freshmen Addie Davis and senior Joe Eddy. Addie was this year's Creed Speaker, she received a silver award. Joe was our Extemporaneous Speaker, he also received a silver award.

The six teams that qualified for state competition included Ag. Mechanics, Dairy Judging, Livestock Judging, Dairy Foods, Farm Management, and FFA Knowledge.

The Ag. Mechanics team, Clint Campbell, Eric Miller, Rick Hammond and Aaron Neal, received 7th place and a Group I rating.

Dairy Judging, Clint Boon, Melanie Beebe, Elizabeth Mammen and Mandy Potts, received a Group II rating.

The Livestock team, Stacey Narr, Billy Smith, Tanya Smith and Kerri Stoner, received 9th place and a Group I rating.

The Dairy Foods team, Sharla George, Jackie Skipper, Laura Skipper

and Anne Stedem, received a Group II rating.

The Farm Management team, Joe Eddy, Cory Johnson, Gina Smith and Matt Williams, received 2nd place and a Group I rating. Individual high scorers were Gina Smith—2nd, Joe Eddy—3rd, and Cory Johnson—8th place.

The FFA Knowledge team, Doug Bonderer, Ashlee Johnson, Katie Stephens, Katie Leach and Jeremy Bowes, received 9th place and a Group I rating. Individual high scorer was Katie Stephens—5th place.

Individual accomplishments in the chapter include Scott Potter, who received an Area Proficiency Award in Forage. Billy Smith, who received a WLC Scholarship through the MO FFA Alumni. Laura Skipper, who participated in the FFA talent.

As a chapter we received 4th place in the BOAC competition, Building Our American Communities.

Annual Awards and Scholarships — 1994-95

JERRY LITTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Mrs. Mildred Litton will present a \$1,000.00 scholarship to a graduating senior in the Chillicothe Chapter.

The recipient must show evidence of strong leadership potential as demonstrated in FFA, school and community activities, and plans to continue his/her formal education.

SENIOR AGRI-BUSINESS AWARD

This award will be given annually to a senior student enrolled in the Agri-Business placement program who is planning to further his/her education in a two- or four-year college program.

The award is designed to recognize the student who has done an outstanding job while in the Agri-Business placement program and demonstrated leadership ability now and in his/her future career plans.

This award is sponsored by Bob and Pat Smith and will be in the amount of \$100.

STATE BANK AWARD

The Chillicothe State Bank presents a trophy and a \$50 check to a member of each of the four Production Agriculture classes.

The award is based on quality and scope of the member's farming program and on the member's knowledge of record keeping and management.

AGRI-BUSINESS AWARDS

Chillicothe Animal Hospital, Dr. Ross and Dr. Gwin present a trophy and a \$50 check to the outstanding member of each of the four Agri-Business classes.

The award is based on leadership, participation, career development and FFA goals.

NRCS AWARD

The NRCS Award is given by the Soil Conservation Service. It is a trophy given to a student who shows the most ability of evaluating the soil and is based on the student's performance at District and State Contests.

The Marshall Meservey family will give this award which will consist of a \$400 check to the graduating senior who plans to enter farming. Selection is based upon grades, efficiency of farm operations, quality of Record Book participation, goals, knowledge of agriculture, and FFA leadership.

HY-VEE AWARD

Hy-Vee Food Stores will present twenty-five dollars and a trophy to the high individuals on the Meats, Dairy Foods, Poultry, Livestock Judging and Dairy Teams. DONALD FIFER MEMORIAL AGRICULTURAL MECHANICS AWARD

The Donald Fifer Agricultural Mechanics Award will be given annually to one student in the Freshman, Sophomore, Junior and Senior classes. The award will consist of a \$25 check and a trophy.

The applicant must complete an application to be eligible for the award. The award is based on the projects constructed and completed in the Shop class of the current year. The size and cost of the project, the quality of work and grades in Vocational Agriculture Shop classes are also used in determining the winner of the award.

Bank Midwest presents a trophy and a \$75 check to a member of each of the four classes.

The award is based on the total amount of points earned by each member for participating in the different FFA activities during the year.

CHILLICOTHE FFA CHAPTER SCHOLARSHIPS

The Chillicothe FFA Chapter presents \$300 scholarships to senior FFA members who are planning to attend a college or vocational school majoring in agriculture. The members must have completed four units of Vocational Agriculture and is based on leadership in FFA, grades in Vocational Agriculture and other school service, and need for additional funds.

STEVE BAUERMEISTER MEMORIAL AWARD

Given annually to the most outstanding agriculture mechanics project for the current school year.

The winner must submit an application to be eligible as winner of a \$100 savings bond and a trophy.

Criteria for winning are quality, scope and timely completion of the project.

The previous winner is Shawn Epperson.

REEDS SEEDS AWARD

Reeds Seeds presents a trophy and a \$25 check to each of the two Star Greenhands and the two Star Chapter Farmers. The Star Greenhand Award is given to an outstanding first-year student in both the agri-business and the production agriculture program, and the Star Chapter Farmer is given to second-year students in both areas. The award is based on scholarship, leadership, S.O.E. Program, and participation.

JERRY LITTON MEMORIAL LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT AWARD

The Constitution-Tribune, Young Farmers Wives, and 4 Ag teachers sponsor \$350 to pay the expenses of three officers to the Washington, D.C., Leadership Conference.

The winners' names will be engraved on a plaque in the Vocational Agriculture classroom and they will represent the Chapter at a week-long leadership conference in Washington, D.C., during the summer.

SINGER AWARD

This award is presented in memory of John Yeomans. The award is given to the winner of the local FFA Public Speaking contest. The winner of the local FFA Public Speaking contest represents the Chillicothe FFA Chapter at the Area II competition. The award consists of a check of \$100.00

WAYNE BOON MEMORIAL AWARD

The Wayne Boon Memorial Award will be presented to a graduating senior each year. The winner will be selected based

upon the scope and quality of their production related SAE program for all of their years in Vo-Ag. Applicants are required to submit a written explanation of their SAE program. The discussion should also explain what they began with, how they expanded the project, production records (yield/acre, average litter size, etc.) and any special awards they have received. They must also submit a copy of their SAE final report for each year.

FIELD CROPS AWARD

The Field Crop Award is presented to a student who shows the most aptitude in crop production. Winners are selected on their performance at District and State Field Crops Contest.

The previous winner is Mandy Potts.

FARM BUREAU PUBLIC SPEAKING AWARD

The Farm Bureau Public Speaking Award will be presented annually to the FFA member who represents the Chillicothe FFA at the District Farm Bureau Speaking Contest.

The previous winner is Joe Eddy.

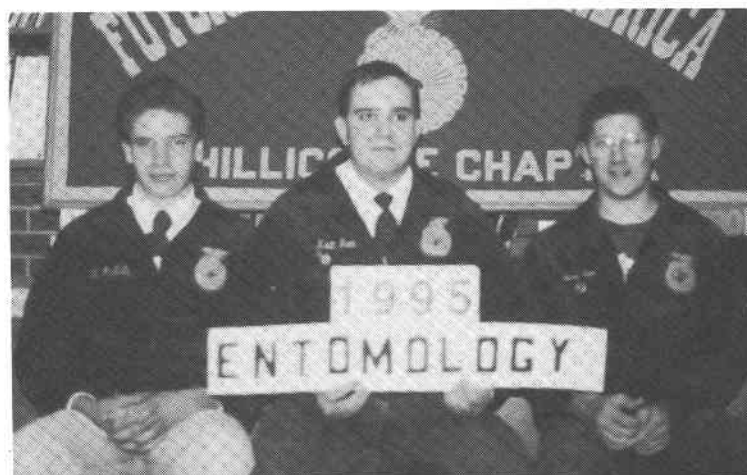
CHILLICOTHE LIVESTOCK MARKET AWARD

The Chillicothe Livestock Market Award will be given annually to a first-year student in vocational agriculture who would like to pursue or expand his/her Supervised Agricultural Experience Program in beef cattle. The award will be \$200 toward the purchase of an open or bred heifer, bred cow or cow/calf pair.

Selection guidelines are facilities available to house the beef SAE project, future plans for beef SAE project, interest in beef industry, future career plans, FFA participation, attitude, citizenship and cooperation at school (assigned by agriculture teachers).

SHEEP ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

This award will be presented annually to a Senior FFA member who exhibited sheep as part of their SAE project. It is intended to recognize a student who has successfully completed their sheep projects, but has received no formal prizes or awards. The criteria for selection include care of animals, work ethic, pride in ownership and sportsmanship. The award consists of a \$50 savings bond and a trophy and is sponsored by Larry and Ida Brotherton.
